#### 1. Chairman's opening remarks (SH)

SH welcomed everyone to the AGM and thanked EOSA for hosting us.

#### 2. Treasurer's report (SH on behalf of MM)

SH opened by sharing MM's apologies for not being able to attend the AGM and reporting that the accounts were looking healthy.

#### 3. Secretary's report (LT)

We're still continuing to fulfil our club objectives that Richard laid out last year, which are:

- Encouraging the practice, promotion, development and participation of amateur athletics in Ely and the wider community
- · Providing training for members
- Organising open, league, championship and club running races
- · Organising teams to represent the Club in championships and leagues
- Catering for the following athletics disciplines: Road Running, Track Running, Cross-Country Running, Fell Running, and Race Walking

#### A brief update on ongoing projects in the club:

<u>UK Athletics Club Standards:</u> We are now fully up to date with the documentation required to meet England Athletics' Club standards. This includes having:

- A club constitution and legal structure
- A committee that has a president or chair, club secretary, treasurer, membership secretary, welfare officer and DBS verifier (with at least three people on the committee in these key roles that are unrelated or not cohabiting)
- · A grievance and disciplinary policy
- · A privacy notice

- An Inclusion Policy
- · A code of conduct
- One lead welfare officer and at least one additional welfare officer

In addition, a social media policy will soon be made available.

#### 5k League

It will now be known as the Summer 5k Series sponsored by Arkwrights.

Rob has got verbal agreement from Ben's Yard that they are happy to host our race. It's still a building site so there's work to do to identify a suitable route for 300+ runners, but it's looking promising. Alli Berry and I visited them at the end of January and the site will have great facilities. There's still some questions over using the on-site toilets as they technically shut at 7pm, but we're going to work through the details in the coming months.

Rob will circulate the proposed dates next week. There will be 6 races this year.

Current membership:

310 members (57 juniors, 253 seniors) 76 members had EA affiliation in 2022-23

94 members joined during 2022-23, 20 of them were graduates of the beginners' course

We're now back up to our pre-pandemic levels and it's wonderful to see just how many members are joining as a result of doing the beginners course.

Remains to say: thanks to all the members of the Committee and the Events Working Group for their time and expertise in 2022, and also everyone in the club who has been part of a such a great year for the club after a really tough 2020 and 2021. And thanks to Richard and all other committee members for answering any questions that I had about various secretary jobs as I found my feet in the role, no matter how silly those questions may have been!

#### 4. Training report (JT)

JT started by praising the beginners and the junior sections of the club, and those involved in the organisation and coaching of these groups for their commitment to the club and the resulting boost to our numbers.

He went on to praise the benefits of the Sunday chatty runs for all members, with the kind and sensible approach that they take.

It was reported that the group training was fully established and continuing to work well, reducing the numbers of runners that turn up at each training location across the city. The number of LiRFs, CiRFs and experienced club runners that have taken on the role of run leaders means the responsibility is well spread. The group structure also continues to allow for some sessions to offer regular coaching for seniors and provide a more supportive experience for newer members.

JT mentioned how successful the Woodditton run had been, and how welcome it was to have it fully back up and running post COVID. Many members new and old took part, and it continues to be a real highlight of the club's calendar.

He also mentioned that he was now looking into race walking as another event that he and other club members could potentially get involved in, and requested that any club members get in touch with any training ideas related to this or to the club more generally.

#### 5. Junior Section report (AR on behalf of MB)

AR reported that the juniors were going to compete at the Ipswich 5k, and that they had come 2nd in the Frostbite League, an outstanding achievement. He also commented that the Ely junior park run was helping to boost numbers.

#### 6. Beginners' Representative Report (JS)

Yet again the current course started with a good uptake (close to 40), and as is often the case, a few didn't show up and some dropped out over the initial few weeks. This intake has been a little unusual in that there are some runners who, despite our efforts, are not managing to get the level needed to complete the course with a 5K run at the end of it: this might be due to them not doing anything between Monday sessions. We have retained decent numbers this time though, and the dedicated beginners seem to be really enjoying the course.

There are a few challenges:

- 1. Lack of venues near enough to the Paradise that are well-lit. Some of our venues are a little too far away for people new to running to get to and still do a decent session.
- 2. The system of using Paypal for the beginners' fee is way better than cash and cheques, but, is there no way Justin can be alerted to payments so he can keep track?
- 3. Despite coaches' efforts, people keep turning up with no HI-VIZ. Could the club pay for a bulk purchase of high vest bibs so that we can hand them out to people who keep forgetting?
- 4. Ann is addressing the matter of the inadequate COACH jackets.

As usual, beginners works due to the dedication of the coaches, who turn up after work, often in the cold. Thank you to them all, and thank you to Kayleigh, who has helped out most weeks.
